Guideposts for Great Lent

Matthew 22:37-Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. (KJV)

Our relationship with the Lord God merits our complete attention throughout life. Great Lent is the annual opportunity to examination our relationship with the Lord. The Church provides Great Lent for self-examination and encourages repentance. Church services encourage repentance and focusing on our life in Jesus Christ. Believers are afforded the opportunity to confess sins and reunite with Christ. The Church provides nourishment, instruction and the experience of communion. John 14:6-Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me. (KJV)

The Lord Jesus Christ is direct in saying He is the way, the truth and the life. Attentive believers take Jesus' words to heart and apply them throughout life.
