Proverbs 15:8-The sacrifice of the wicked is an abomination to the Lord: but the prayer of the upright is his delight. (KJV)

Proverbs of Holy Scripture provide sound guidance for believers seeking to pray. The Lord's delight in the prayer of the upright is clearly documented in Proverbs. The hunger in the soul to seek and unite with the Lord is satisfied in daily prayer. Believers reaching out to the Lord God in sincere prayer add to recorded history. The beneficial value and history of prayer is well-recorded in the Holy Scriptures, Authoritative writings of the Church in addition to Holy Scripture are easily found.
