

Holiness

2 Corinthians 7:1-Having therefore these promises, dearly beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God. (KJV)

Holy Apostle Paul has written important words about holiness to consider. Attentiveness to the Apostle Paul's writing is beneficial for believers.

The Lord God gives each person the freedom to choose the path of life. God's Heavenly Kingdom is set forth as the desirable goal for believers. Believers are challenged by Apostle Paul to rid themselves of filthiness. Ridding the self of filthiness of flesh and spirit requires conscious decisions.

Ephesians 4:24-And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness. (KJV)

Believers determine the goals and relationships cherished in earthly life.

Baptism, Chrismation, Confession and Communion renew the believer.

God cleanses believers seeking to be partakers of the new life in Christ.

Righteousness and holiness are possible only when living in Jesus Christ.

The path to God's Kingdom is narrow and can be very long in years.

The believer benefits when fully embracing righteousness and holiness.

I Thessalonians 4:7-For God hath not called us unto uncleanness, but unto holiness. (KJV)

Valuing holiness is a guiding determinant for the serious believer each day.

All that is not of Christ is to be firmly and resolutely rejected in daily life.

Believers seeking God's Kingdom keep their eyes and ears clearly focused.

Seekers of holiness have Jesus Christ first in the heart, mind and soul

Christ is primary in life when righteousness and holiness are deeply valued.

Answering God's call to holiness requires discerning daily decisions.

Hebrews 12:14-Follow peace with all men, and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord: (KJV)

The Church provides the teachings and nourishment for peace and holiness.

Conscious decision-making and guarding the heart lead to personal peace.

Embracing Jesus Christ in the heart, mind and soul is needed for holiness.

The nature of daily relationships reflects whether holiness is greatly valued.

Peace is most fully experienced when Jesus Christ is the center of life.

Holiness is rooted in Jesus Christ and exists only through Jesus Christ.
